## 2010 Tree Packet Information

**Common name,** (number of items per pack), price per pack, *Latin name* & species info.

**Rain barrel** (1) \$120 typically \$160. By Spruce Creek, elegant design with 54 gallon capacity and brass spigot

**Compost bin** (1) \$60 typically about \$100. Earth Machine brand. Comes with simple directions..

**White Flowering Dogwood** (5) \$10.00: *Cornus florida*- Produces white flowers in early Spring. It has dark red fall leaves and bright red berries. A small tree with a height of 13' – 15'.

**Eastern Redbud** (5) \$10.00: *Cercis Canadensis*- Small pink flowers in early spring. Large heart-shaped leaves. Grows to 25' and spreads to 12' in width.

**Sugar Maple** (3) \$6.00: *Acer saccharum*- Native syrup bearing Maple, Beautiful curly lumber, dark green leaves that then turn brilliant yellow in fall. Reaches 50 – 75' in height in many soil types.

**Tulip Poplar Tree** (3) \$6.00: *Liriodendron tulipifera*- Native magnolia that can be a pioneer species, tulip shaped leaves. large pale pink/orange flowers in spring. Heavily adaptable to many soil types. Prefers full to partial sun.

**Red Oak** (3) \$6.00: *Quercus borealis*- Fairly rapid grower. Reaches 60' – 70'. Dark green leaves turn red in fall. No serious pests. Adaptable to city conditions. Vibrant red oak lumber. Acorns serve as a nut source for wildlife.

**White Oak** (3) \$6.00: *Quercus alba*-Grows to a height of 70' - 90'. Bright green leaves, vibrant red fall color. Handles wet or variable soils, very nice white oak lumber. Acorns serve as a nut source for wildlife.

**Pecan** (3) \$6.00: *Carya illinoensis*-Grows to 75'-95'. Large compound light green leaves, turning rusty brown in fall Very straight and tall tree, nuts for wildlife and wood for beautiful lumber. Edible nut sold in stores.

**Weeping Willow** (5) \$10.00: *Salix babylonica*- This tree can be used to stabilize stream banks, and tolerate very wet areas. It will grow in many wet soils, and can tolerate dry soil. Sun to partial sun. Fast growth.

**Dawn Redwood** ( 5) \$10.00: *Metasequia glyptostroboides* – The living fossil, lineage millions of years old. easily adapts to very wet or dry soils of rich, poor, or average composition. Needles turn rusty brown in fall.

**Paperbark Birch** (3) \$8.00: *Betula papyrifera*- Rapid grower. Prefers moist to wet soil. Full sun/part shade. White papery bark that peels off. Also called the canoe birch, and was used by native americans as paper.

**Old Fashioned Lilac** (3) \$8.00: *Syringa vulgaris*- Dense vigorous growth to 15' in height. Extremely fragrant flowers appear in late spring. Space 6' apart.

**Red Osier Dogwood Bush:** (5) \$10.00 *Cornus sericea*– Grows 7-9'. Abundant fruit eaten by birds, and dense vegetation provides excellent habitat for wildlife. Bright red stems provide winter interest.

**Forsythia** (5) \$10.00: *Forsythia x intermedia*- Very fast upright growth to 7'. Deep golden flowers. Can withstand adverse city conditions with ordinary to poor soil.

**Hazelnut** (5) \$10.00: *Corylus americana* - Known as the American Hazelnut or Filbert. Shrub that can grow to 15'. Small pink flowers, edible nut attracts people and wildlife. Beautiful fall color of deep orange to purple red.

**Butterfly Bush:** (1 gallon pot) \$6.00 *Buddleia davidii*- 'Black Knight' Grows 5-9'. Plant this shrub to attract hummingbirds and butterflies. Dark purple flowers. Dead head faded flowers for rebloom throughout the fall.

**Arborvitae** (5) \$10.00: *Thuja occidentalis*- Also known as white cedar. Grows to 40' with a 10-15' spread. Lush, dark green summer color.

**White Pine** (10) \$10.00: *Pinus strobes*– Grows tall and stately. It has long, soft, deep green needles. Grows well in a variety of soils and will tolerate amounts of shade. Attains a height of 60' -70'.

**Colorado Blue Spruce** (5) \$8.00: *Picea pungens*- Four year old transplants which have developed more stems and root systems than seedlings. Short stiff blue-green to shining blue needles. Requires fertile soil.

**Miniature Fountain Grass** (1 gallon pot) \$6.00: *Pennisetum alopecuroides* 'Little Bunny' Most compact and first of the Fountain Grasses to bloom, flowering most strongly in July and sporadically until frost. 10" tall.

**Variegated Maiden Grass** (1 gallon pot) \$6.00 *Miscanthus sinensis* "Morning Light" narrow pale green leaves with white stripe and puffy plumes. Ht 4-5ft foliage, flowers 5-6ft/ Sunny location.

**Myrtle/Periwinkle** 2 1/4" pots (50) \$28.00 : *Vinca minor*- 3-6" One of the best groundcovers for partial sun or full shade. Extra large leaf, with blue-violet flowers March –April. Space clumps 6" apart.

**Fertilizer Tablets** (12) \$3.00 : Drop in root hole at time of planting, but should not touch roots.

**Marking Flag** (10) \$1.00: 30" wire with bright plastic flag. Useful for identifying newly planted seedlings.

**Bluebird Box** (1) \$20.00: Made of cedar. Approximately 8" x 9" x 5". Face opening southeast.

**Squirrel House** (1) \$40.00 9.5" x 11" x 21.5" Door opens up for cleaning. Two entrance/exit holes for protection.

**Tree Shelter** (1 set) \$ 2.00: (1) 2' tree shelter with (1) 2 1/2 ' bamboo stake.
